Nominations are now being sought for the 2015 Brain Prize; the Brain prize has been established by a private Danish foundation, the Grete Lundbeck European Brain Research Foundation.



The Prize recognises highly original and influential advances in research on the nervous system. If several researchers have contributed significantly to this achievement, more than one individual may receive the Prize. Nominees can be of any nationality but the research for which they are nominated must have been conducted in Europe or in collaboration with researchers in Europe. This Prize is intended to raise the visibility of European neuroscience and to be a stimulus to this important field of research. Nominations can be made by logging onto
